


East German Rose Garden Forst (Lausitz)

Since 1913









History

In the last decades of the 19th century, the cloth makers´ town Forst became one of the leading centres of the German textile industry, earning it the name "German Manchester of the East". With the increase in wealth and the number of its inhabitants, the desire for rest and relaxation in the bosom of nature intensified. This is how the history of a fairytale park landscape began...

The idea of creating a public park on the island of Wehrinsel in the south of the city began to take shape. It then resulted in the first big rose and horticultural exhibition in June 1913, dedicated to the 25th anniversary of Kaiser Wilhelm II's coronation. The success of the four-month exhibition, attended by 350,000 visitors, marked the beginning of the history of today's East German Rose Garden.

Garden & Rose

The historic park on the Lusatian Neisse with over 100 years of tradition is protected by monuments. The 17-hectare park impresses visitors with its unique composition of garden art, land-scape architecture and botanical diversity. Rose lovers and experts have the opportunity to admire tens of thousands of roses in almost 1000 varieties. The queen of flowers not only shapes the image of the East German Rose Garden, but also of the entire city, which has been called Rosenstadt Forst (Lausitz) since 2004.

In 2022, the East German Rose Garden was internationally awarded at the World Federation of Rose Societies in Adelaide (Australia) given the Adward of Garden Excellence for outstanding rose gardens.

Cultural events

The Rose Garden, in addition to its great historical value in terms of monuments, is also a scene of high-ranking cultural programmes. In a magical setting of the garden and during the peak season of roses, unique cultural events are organized.
